To champion the creation of a river park system along the 52-mile San Diego River.

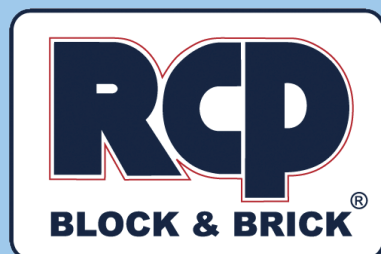
This river park system will provide the community with recreational activities and a greater connection with nature.

Who are the Friends of Santee's River Park?

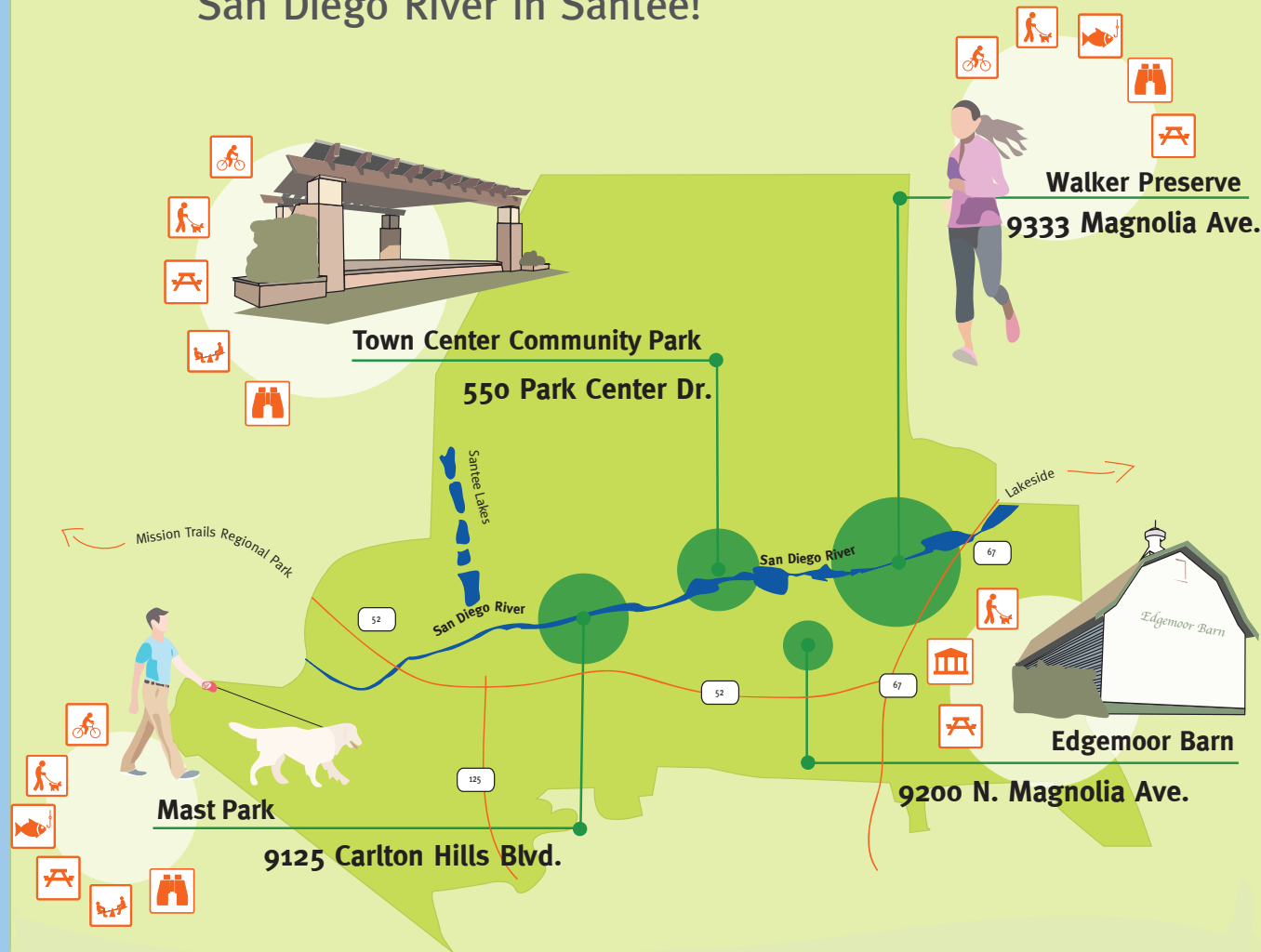

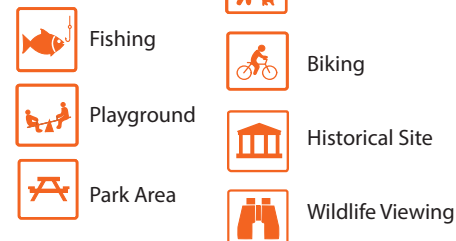


SANTEE'S RIVER PARK

The River's Story

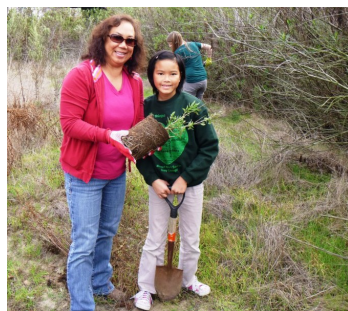
For over 8,000 years, the San Diego River has been vital to our region. In 1769, it became one of the most important rivers in the United States with the founding of the first European settlement on the west coast along its banks. For this reason, the San Diego River is recognized as "California's First River."



But what has become of the river?

The river has become neglected and forgotten in recent years. It is now polluted to the point that it is considered one of our nation's most polluted waterways. As such, the river's vital ecological functioning is in danger of being lost.
